Open Session

Dr. Knight established that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order at 10:11 a.m.

Dr. Goggans made a motion and Ms. Mattingly seconded and the Board voted to enter into Executive Session in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 43-1-19(h), § 43-11-47(h), § 43-1-2(h) and § 50-14-3(b)(2). Voting in favor of the motion were those present who included Dr. Michael Knight, Dr. Lisa Shilman, Dr. Greg Goggans, Ms. Misty Mattingly, Dr. Lacey Green, Dr. Glenn Maron, Dr. Larry Miles, Dr. David Reznik, Mr. Mark Scheinfeld, Dr. Jeffrey Schultz, Ms. Lisa Selfe, Dr. Brent Stiehl, Dr. Debra Wilson, and Dr. Nancy Young.

Executive Session

Update on budget discussions and general housekeeping.

No votes were taken in Executive Session. Dr. Knight declared the meeting back in Open Session.

Open Session

Dr. Knight established that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order at 10:29 a.m.

Introduction of Visitors

Dr. Knight welcomed the visitors and asked that they introduce themselves.

Approval of Minutes

Dr. Maron made a motion to approve the Open and Executive Session minutes from the August 2, 2024, meeting. Dr. Shilman seconded, and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion.

Report of Licenses Issued

Dr. Maron made a motion to ratify the list of licenses issued. Dr. Green seconded, and the Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion.

Petitions for Rule Waiver or Variance

Rule Variance Petition from Dr. Elise Marie de Latour: The Board discussed this request for a waiver of Rule 150-3-0.1(j). The Board reviewed the petition and discussed whether there is exists evidence of a hardship. The Board found that a hardship existed, but further found that a rule variance or waiver was not the correct vehicle by which to address the hardship.

Dr. Shilman made a motion to deny the petition. Dr. Green seconded, and the Board voted to deny the petition. In denying this petition, the Board determined that the appropriate method of licensure in this situation is licensure by credentials. In its denial, the Board stated that the petitioner should apply for licensure by credentials, and that in consideration of her military-spouse status, the Board would waive the application fee.

Correspondence

Letter from Suzanne Newkirk -Regarding Rule 150-5-.07(1) Administration of Local Anesthetic by Dental Hygienists and Periodontal Maintenance under general supervision.

["A dental hygienist, under the direct supervision of a Georgia licensed dentist, may administer local anesthesia for hygiene purposes, including intraoral block anesthesia, soft tissue infiltration anesthesia, or both, to a non-sedated patient that requires local anesthesia for pain management and who is 18 years of age or older if the following criteria are met."]

In this letter, Ms. Newkirk requests that the Board consider authorizing Georgia supervising dentists to delegate periodontal maintenance procedures to dental hygienists working under general supervision. Ms. Newkirk asked the Board to revisit Rule 150-5-.07 and consider removing the restriction that prevents Georgia supervising dentists the authority to delegate to their dental hygienists the administration of local anesthetic to patients being seen by the doctor.

Ms. Mattingly agreed with Ms. Newkirk and stated that she would like to see this rule reviewed by the rules committee. Dr. Maron advised that he was concerned by hygienists performing this procedure and asked the hygienists present to identify the advantage of the hygienists injecting the patient for the dentist. Ms. Mattingly responded that it is an access to care issue. Dr. Maron stated that he did not see a clinical reason that this is necessary and that access to care is not considered clinical. He again proposed the question of what the clinical advantage of a hygienist is injecting the patient over the dentist. Ms. Mattingly asked Dr. Maron what the advantage of the dentist performing the procedure versus a hygienist. Ms. Mattingly stated that Georgia set the precedent for this issue and that Texas has followed Georgia. She added that in educational settings, even in residency programs, that hygienists anesthetize doctor's patients. She believes that this is also practiced in pediatric settings. Dr. Shilman advised that was not the case for pediatric settings and that she pushed for the age limit to be 18 because she thinks if hygienists are injecting that they should only be injecting for periodontal purposes.

Dr. Knight recognized Dr. Reznik for comment. Dr. Reznik inquired if anyone knew how many people have

completed the course for giving local injections and how many have been approved. He advised that in the Sedation Committee many applications have been rejected. He is still opposed to the idea until after the Board has more data on how to move forward. Ms. Mattingly stated she believes this is another reason why she would like to see the rule go before the rules committee for further analysis.

Dr. Knight recognized Dr. Schultz for comment. Dr. Schultz stated he was not present for the majority of this discussion as a Board member, but he believes that this is an issue that should be brought by the doctors and not the hygienists. He believes that if the doctors believe that this will increase the workflow and improves patient care then it should come from the doctors in some form or fashion and not necessarily from the hygiene association. Ms. Mattingly responded that multiple letters have been sent to the Board regarding this issue while the rule was being considered and afterwards from doctors that are in favor of this issue. Ms. Mattingly stated that she believes that this was not from the hygiene association and that Ms. Newkirk is a hygienist from our state and that many doctors have come out in support of this issue. Dr. Knight stated that he would like to see those letters. Ms. Mattingly asked Director Joiner if he could pull those letters that were sent to the Board.

Dr. Knight recognized Dr. Miles for comment. Dr. Miles stated from a personal standpoint as an aging dentist, he prefers dental hygienists numbing up his patients.

Dr. Knight said he recalls when this issue was first being discussed that he actually brought this issue up and was not even acknowledged because two hygienists from other states, that did have licenses in Georgia, brought up the fact that they sedate for their dentist when the dentists were running behind. Dr. Knight believes that this is more of a production issue and not a quality-of-care issue and that he has a problem with that. He recalled that another hygienist stated that they inject patients that have an abscess to see if the patient can be numbed up enough for the doctor to do something.

Dr. Reznik made a motion to table the discussion on the ability of hygienists to give local anesthesia on behalf of dentists. Dr. Wilson seconded, and the Board voted in favor of the motion. Ms. Mattingly was opposed believing that the issue should go to the rules committee.

Director Joiner asked Dr. Knight how the Board would like to respond to Ms. Newkirk's correspondence.

Dr. Knight recognized Ms. Mattingly for comment. Ms. Mattingly made a motion to move this to the rules committee for evaluation. Dr. Young seconded, and the Board voted in favor of the motion.

Dr. Reznik mentioned that there is a second component to the letter, revisiting the periodontal maintenance. He believes that this does increase access to care for patients. Dr. Wilson mentioned that other states allow this. Ms. Mattingly stated that she believes that South Carolina is the only other state that only allows hygienists to perform periodontal maintenance under direct supervision. Ms. Mattingly stated that when she made her request to send the issue to rules committee, she was including both items mentioned in this letter.

Ms. Mattingly made a motion to move the periodontal maintenance portion of the rule to go to the rules committee for evaluation. Ms. Selfe seconded, and the Board voted in favor of the motion.

Letter from Ms. Shohreh Ghasemi requesting to meet before the Board to discuss her voluntary cease and desist order.

Dr. Knight asked Deputy Director Altman to provide background information for this request. Ms. Ghasemi was investigated for practicing dentistry without a license. She was presented with a voluntary cease-and-desist order. With advice from counsel Ms. Ghasemi signed the order. Ms. Ghasemi is requesting to have the voluntary cease-and-desist order removed.

Dr. Knight recognized Dr. Stiehl for comment. Dr. Stiehl advised that Ms. Ghasemi was performing face lifts without a license in Georgia. She was investigated and found guilty of what she was accused of doing. She signed the cease-and-desist order with advice from her counsel but now that it is public she is looking to have the cease-and-desist order removed. She is claiming that it affects her ability to lecture worldwide. Dr. Stiehl concluded that the cease-and-desist order was given to her to make her stop practicing without a license and that he did not see a need for her to appear before the Board.

Dr. Stiehl made a motion to deny Ms. Ghasemi request to appear before the Board to discuss her voluntary cease-and-desist order. Dr. Maron seconded, and the Board voted in favor of the motion.

General – Dr. Michael Knight

Dr. Knight advised that Ms. Selfe has provided some documentation for the Board’s consideration that will need to be shared and discussed at a later date.

Internal Committee Reports

Sedation Committee Report

Dr. Maron advised that the committee met last week via zoom and had lively discussion. He believes that the session was very informative debate on requirements for sedation permits. The committee reviewed the guidelines for general anesthesia/ conscious sedation on-site evaluations. The current form will need to be updated and the evaluators will need to be informed about the changes that occurred. He believes that based on the debate during the meeting that the committee is split on the issue. After discussion with Dr. Knight, he believes that giving the public an opportunity to have discussion on the topic would be appropriate.

Dr. Maron wanted to make everyone aware that he and Dr. Schultz have reviewed the conscious sedation, enteral and parenteral sedation site evaluation guidelines.

Dr. Maron advised the committee was able to agree that in the course of the next year the committee will be looking to change the names of these permits because they are misnomers, and that Georgia is out of date in terms of what the different levels of sedations are called. For the discussion regarding the medications, the committee will post information that can be reviewed later, as to which drugs are currently mandated and others that should be added to the list. Dr. Maron stated that the committee is acutely aware of the importance and significance of sedation and the potential threat to the public.

Since the committee disagrees on what should be added to the rules, the committee has decided to table this discussion for further debate and to allow for public input in open session. Dr. Knight advised the Board to do their homework so that everyone is ready to contribute to the discussion.

Dr. Knight recognized Dr. Goggans for comment. Dr. Goggans asked for clarification on what specifically was being reviewed. Dr. Maron clarified that the issues are the levels of sedation as currently written and the types of permits that are currently written. The sedation committee, over the course of this last year, has reviewed materials and how things are handled currently to modify them and make recommendations to the Board for changes. Dr. Maron gave the example that one of the issues that the committee is looking at is the availability of emergency drugs and how certain drugs are used in emergency settings. Dr. Knight mentioned that it needs to be determined what levels of certain types of medication should be introduced and the appropriate settings.

Infection Control Committee Report

Dr. Reznik advised that there is another case of *mycobacteroides abscessus* in Georgia affecting a child. Dr. Knight asked how many cases have been in Georgia. Dr. Reznik advised that there were 15 cases back in 2022 that have been published. This is a new case that is still under investigation. Changes have been made

to the continuing education requirements to include infection control around diluted waterlines. The committee will be looking into the new case and determine what further actions need to be taken to protect children. Dr. Reznik is concerned because this has now happened more in Georgia than in any other state. He believes that this issue needs to be address because there are too many unknowns as to why this keeps happening.

Dr. Maron asked if the new case was from a pediatric office. Dr. Reznik answered that the new case was not in the same office where the cases occurred back in 2022. He mentioned that since the case was still under investigation that he was asked by Dr. Shirley not to share all of the information that is known at this time.

Dr. Maron reminded the Board that Dr. Reznik, Dr. Young, Dr. Wilson, Dr. Shirley and Ms. Selfe were on the Infection Control Committee. Discussion was had regarding when the committee could meet virtually. The afternoon of September 20, 2024, was selected and Dr. Reznik advised that he will confirm that Dr. Shirley is available for the meeting.

External Committee Reports

Electronic Database Review Advisory Committee (PDMP) Report – Dr. Lisa Shilman

Dr. Shilman had no report.

CRDTS Steering Committee Report – Dr. Brent Stiehl

Dr. Stiehl advised that CRDTS had their annual meeting in Kansas City on August 23, 2024. CRDTS will be merging with SRTA pending certain contracts that need to be worked out and the merger should happen around the 31st. He mentioned that they did discuss the licensure compacts that seemd to be coming our way. CRDTS wanted to make sure that the board knows that the CSG compact allows for licensure with no hands skills test which could be a concern for the Board. They do seem to be more in line with the AADB compact. Dr. Stiehl advised that the biggest concern is in the way that it is written which is pretty much exclusively that the CDCA-WREB-CITA organization exclusively provides the testing. CRDTS is asking that the Board contact that compact to see if we can add CRDTS to the list of authorized testing agencies. They don't want a monopoly but the way it's written right now is there would be a monopoly on who offers the test. Possible impact to the Board would be that this might make things tough for the students to pay for testing. They have also offered to come before the Board so they can tell the Board more about the program and answer any questions.

CRDTS Examination Committee Report – Dr. Ami Patel

Dr. Patel had to leave for an emergency but advised Dr. Knight that she had no report.

Dental College of Georgia Liaison Report – Dr. Michael Knight

Dr. Knight reminded the Board that the December meeting will be held at the college.

CDCA-WREB-CITA Steering Committee Report – Dr. Ami Patel, Dr. JC Shirley, Ms. Misty Mattingly, RDH

Dr. Knight asked Ms. Mattingly if the committee had anything to report. She advised that she believes that Dr. Shirley and Dr. Patel should have an update for the Board when they return.

GDHEA Liaison Report – Dr. David Reznik, Ms. Lisa Selfe, RDH

Ms. Selfe advised that the guidelines from the ADA came out regarding lead apron shielding for radiographs and in order for the hygiene school to comply with the new guidelines that rules committee will need to review the current rules.

Dr. Maron wanted clarification as to who was on the rules committee. Director Joiner advised that a list will

be provided later.

Attorney General's Report – Mr. Tommy McNulty

No report.

Executive Director's Report – Director J. Clinton Joiner, II

Director Joiner introduced Mrs. Angela Johnson as the Board's new administrative support staff.

Deputy Director Altman introduced Ms. Kimberly Holland, RPH as Compliance Investigator who is a registered dental hygienist for the state of Georgia. It was noted that Ms. Holland will be working for the Board and is not a shared resource.

Director Joiner noted that he has been working with DCH, Dr. Knight and the Governor's Office to obtain additional funding to hire more investigators as the need has rapidly increased. He further reported that he recently attended DCH's division directors meeting for the first time and was able to bring more attention to the Board's needs.

Director Joiner advised that DCH is constantly working to advance healthcare and that one of the ways it is looking at providing more access is via telehealth services. The DCH Directors were provided a demonstration of the new health stations or pods that were installed by SHBP, which is the state's health benefit plan, during the past meeting. These health stations are covered by the state's health insurance and covers all state employees, including some of the school systems. The booths are located downstairs on the plaza level of the building. The stations resemble large telephone booths. A person enters the booth and taps the screen to start the session, the windows turn opaque, and the provider appears on the screen in front of you. The booth has the ability to take blood pressure, temperature and get your weight. Director Joiner noted that something that would possibly interest the Board would be how the booth has attachments (stethoscope, high-definition infrared camera, etc.) that come down from the ceiling. These particular units are designed to allow the provider to see into the patient's throat.

Director Joiner advised that it would be beneficial for the Board to see how these stations work. He believes that these types of technological abilities could provide the Board with knowledge on how tele-dentistry could potentially be implemented. He has set up a demonstration for the Board at the November meeting.

Legal Services – Director J. Clinton Joiner, II

No report.

Miscellaneous

Rule 150-7-0.2 Faculty Licenses

Dr. Young advised that there are couple areas of proposed changes to the rule under sections 150-07-0.2(2)(a)(4), 150-07-0.2(2)(a)(5) and 150-07-0.2(3).

Section 150-07-0.2(2)(a)(4) currently reads:

["After an applicant has demonstrated his or her qualifications by completing the application and complying with the requirements, the Board, in its discretion, may then issue a dental faculty license to a qualified dentist for the sole purpose of teaching dentistry in an ADA accredited dental college, or other dental clinic in the State of Georgia as approved by the Board."]

Proposed change:

["After an applicant has demonstrated his or her qualifications by completing the application and complying with the requirements, the Board, in its discretion, may then issue a dental faculty license

to a qualified dentist for the sole purpose of teaching dentistry ~~in~~ **associated with** an ADA accredited dental college, or other dental clinic in the State of Georgia as approved by the Board.”]

Section 150-07-0.2(2)(a)(5) currently reads:

[“A dental faculty licensee may engage in the practice of dentistry only on the premises of the school where employed within the scope of their employment as a faculty member for the sole purpose of teaching and instructing.”]

Proposed change:

[“A dental faculty licensee may engage in the practice of dentistry ~~only on the premises of the school~~ **associated with an ADA accredited dental college** where employed and within the scope of their employment as a faculty member for the sole purpose of teaching and instructing.”]

Section 150-07-0.2(3) currently reads:

[“A faculty licensee may not establish practice outside of the physical primary campus of the dental school without first obtaining an unrestricted dental license to practice in Georgia.”]

Proposed change:

[“A faculty licensee may not establish practice outside of **an ADA accredited dental college** ~~of the physical primary campus of the dental school~~ without first obtaining an unrestricted dental license to practice in Georgia.”]

Dr. Young added that these proposed changes will allow faculty to cover students at training events and healthcare events all over the state.

Dr. Knight recognized Dr. Maron for comment. Dr. Maron asked if this change should be more appropriate to say CODA approved and not ADA.

Dr. Knight recognized Director Joiner for comment. Dr. Joiner advised that under O.C.G.A. §43-11-42(a.1)(1) statute covers both.

[“The board may issue, in its discretion, without examination, a teacher’s or instructor’s license to a dentist who has graduated from a school, college, or advanced dental education program approved by the board and accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association (ADA) or its successor agency, if any, for the sole purpose of teaching or instructing, in an accredited dental college, advanced dental education program, or training clinic in this state, those procedures and services recognized in this state to be within the scope of practice of such person’s professional license.....”]

Director Joiner advised that the only possible hurdle would be in the wording for the permit, “...for the sole purpose of teaching or instructing, in an accredited dental college, advanced dental education program, or training clinic in this state, those procedures and services recognized in this state...”, which will depend on what the Board’s interpretation of “in and accredited dental college” means.

Dr. Knight recognized Dr. Young for comment. Dr. Young asked if they have an external clinic where the students are rotating would that be included as a training area. Director Joiner and Dr. Knight confirmed it would be included.

Dr. Maron asked if the language of the proposed changes should be referred to legal as to whether or not it should say COTA or ADA. Ms. Mattingly agreed with Dr. Maron’s statement, but she is good with the proposed changes and would like to see some consistency.

Dr. Knight recognized Mr. McNulty for comment. Mr. McNulty advised that the proposed changes can be sent over to his office for a legal memo and his office can look into the issue. Mr. McNulty stated that he agrees with Director Joiner. If the Board would like his office can look into the wording issue and report back to the Board next month.

Dr. Maron expressed his concern with the delay on the wording of this rule. While he acknowledges that the Board should thoroughly review the rule, he stated that if it is just a matter of semantics, the Board does not need to delay any further and that the Board should move forward and have the required public hearing, so this rule becomes effective, and the health fairs can be scheduled.

Director Joiner advised that he is not sure that the dental students are allowed to work at health fairs or clinics because they are not licensed. That's why the Board has discussed the potential need for an intern dental student license so that they would actually have some kind of license from the board, but it would require direct supervision from a faculty member or a licensed dentist. He reminded the Board that when he proposed the idea, he considered that it could work similar to the way pharmacy has intern permits.

Dr. Knight asked if the Board wanted to make a motion to move the process forward to legal.

Director Joiner advised that if the Board wanted to adopt this language, part of that process is sending it to the AG's office to get legal authority. This would allow the Board to start moving the process along and to Dr. Maron's point rather than holding it up to do a referral.

Dr. Maron made a motion to move this issue forward so that a public hearing can be scheduled. Dr. Goggans seconded, and the Board voted in favor of the motion.

Dr. Knight asked if there were any more questions or further comments

Ms. Mattingly informed the Board that she and Ms. Selfe have been invited to the GDHA 95th annual conference on Friday, September 20, 2024. She also requested that rule 150-9-.02, expanding duties of dental assistants, be reviewed by the rules committee. The Georgia Dental Association has brought it to her attention that the expanded dental assistant schools are struggling with being able to get their dental assistants processed with testing because the rule states that it has to be administered by a licensed dentist. GDA is proposing that the rule be changed to allow testing to be administered by a faculty of the CODA approved school.

Ms. Mattingly made a motion to refer Rule 150-9-.02 to the rules committee for review. Ms. Selfe seconded, and the Board voted in favor of the motion.

Dr. Maron made a motion and Ms. Mattingly seconded and the Board voted to enter into Executive Session in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 43-1-19(h), § 43-11-47(h), § 43-1-2(h) and § 50-14-3(b)(2). Voting in favor of the motion were those present who included Dr. Michael Knight, Dr. Don Spillers, Dr. Greg Goggans, Dr. Lacey Green, Dr. Glenn Maron, Dr. Larry Miles, Dr. Ami Patel, Dr. David Reznik, Mr. Mark Scheinfeld, Dr. Jeffrey Schultz, Ms. Lisa Selfe, Dr. JC Shirley, Dr. Brent Stiehl, Dr. Debra Wilson, and Dr. Nancy Young.
